

3. What we require

Although we adhere to different data protection policies and guidelines, we have put in place a simplified set of procedures to better facilitate your data requests.

First, we require a **formal letter of request**, duly signed by the Head of your organization and stating the purpose of the request and expected data sets needed.

If your request requires nationwide scope or will cover at least two (2) regions, address your letter to the

What Listahanan collects and what you can do.

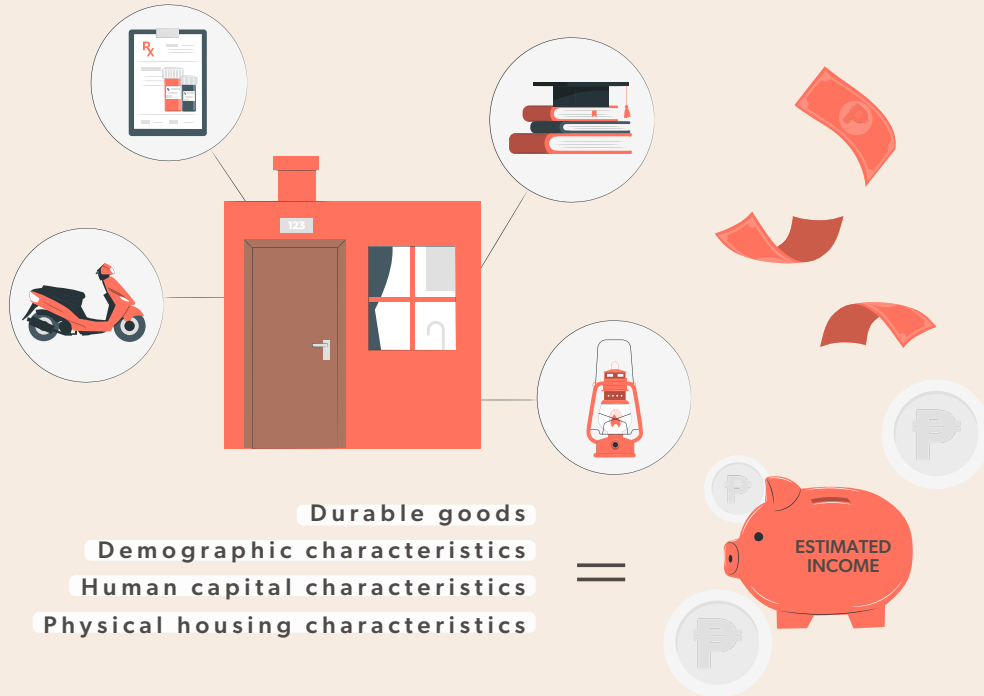
The National Household Targeting System for Poverty Reduction (NHTS-PR), popularly known as Listahanan, is an information management system that identifies who and where the poor are in the Philippines.

It is managed by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through the National Household Targeting Office (NHTO).



1. What we collect

The Listahanan uses a uniform set of proxy or alternative indicators to predict the *per capita* income of a household based on observable characteristics that correlate with, but are easier to measure than income.



After these indicators are calculated and compared to the provincial poverty threshold to determine the poverty status of a household, the Listahanan finalizes its database to produce:

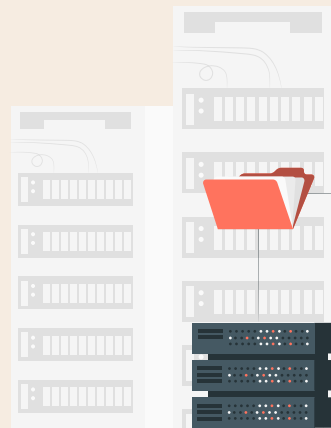
